Cremation and Burial: Did you know? The Catholic Church's attitude toward cremation has changed dramatically over time. The Church has changed its stance saying Resurrection is possible regardless of the method of final disposition. The process of cremation does in hours what nature does over hundreds of years. Cremation is an alternative method of burial. When it comes to burial and existing graves, most cemeteries allow for the burial of up to four cremated remains in an existing grave. What this means is this: if you have a family plot of 6 graves and each grave has a full body in it, you can place 4 cremated remains on top of those graves. A family plot of 6 graves that appears to be full can now accommodate an additional 24 urns. Families do not have to purchase additional graves. This method of burial may not work for everyone. The Cemetery Committee felt it was important for you to know that you do have options.

Catholic Diocese of Sunyani – On June 29 & 30, Rev. Stephen Kow Bosomafi of St. Thomas More Parish, Lake Ariel, on behalf of the Catholic Diocese of Sunyani, West Africa, will conduct their annual Mission Appeal at Good Shepherd and Immaculate Conception Parishes. The Catholic Diocese of Sunyani, West Africa is mostly situated in poor rural areas. The faithful are mainly young families who are mostly first and second generation Christians. The diocese believes in the holistic development of the human person. Part of its mission is to provide some basic development projects. Thus, it focuses on the following areas: primary evangelization, provision of safe drinking water, quality healthcare delivery, and education. Some of the funds we raise in both parishes would be used to support the mission of the Diocese including training of priests and religious. Additionally, funds raised in both parishes will enable them to better serve the people of God in their local churches. Please be as generous as you can. Thank you!

Parish Pastoral Council: Our parishes operate a combined Parish Pastoral Council to serve the members of both parishes. The Parish Pastoral Council guides and determines the direction of the parishes to fulfill the goals of our pastoral plans and the mission of the Church. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis . To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
