Please plan to attend the Baptismal Preparation class well in advance of your baby's birth so that you are aware of all the information necessary to schedule your baby's Baptism.

Cremation and Burial: Did you know? The Catholic Church's attitude toward cremation has changed dramatically over time. The Church has changed its stance saying Resurrection is possible regardless of the method of final disposition. The process of cremation does in hours what nature does over hundreds of years. Cremation is an alternative method of burial. When it comes to burial and existing graves, most cemeteries allow for the burial of up to four cremated remains in an existing grave. What this means is this: if you have a family plot of 6 graves and each grave has a full body in it, you can place UP TO 4 cremated remains on top of those graves. A family plot of 6 graves that appears to be full can now accommodate UP TO an additional 24 urns. Each cemetery individually makes their determination of exactly how many cremations can go into the graves in their particular cemetery. Families do not have to purchase additional graves. This method of burial may not work for everyone. The Cemetery Committee felt it was important for you to know that you do have options.

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically

at <u>www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis</u>. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.



ST. JOHN BOSCO TO HOST "CATHOLIC MYSTICISM" AUTHOR

Catholic Mysticism will be the topic when the Saint John Bosco Roman Catholic Church hosts paranormal author Maxim Furek. The event will be held on Wednesday, July 17, at 6:00 pm at the Saint John Bosco Church, 573 State Rte. 93, Conyngham, PA 18249. The author will discuss aspects of Catholic Mysticism such as miracles and exorcisms, St. Theresa of Avila, Padre Pio, Pope John XXIII, Pope John Paul II, the existence of evil, and the author's friendship with Roman Catholic demonologists Ed and Lorraine Warren. Maxim Furek is the author of the Award-Winning Coal Region Hoodoo: Paranormal Tales from Inside the Pit and The Sheppton Mythology, which investigated one of the miracles of Pope John XXIII and was the 2023 Book of the Month for St John Bosco's Book Club. The author, a Mocanaqua resident, and a Vietnam Veteran brings a unique perspective and a personal connection to Catholic Mysticism, making this event a true community affair. The program is free and open to the public.
